

DESCRIPTION OF AWARD

The College of Southern Idaho Visual Art Program will award several scholarships to deserving individuals for the upcoming academic school year. Each scholarship will reimburse a portion, or all, of an undergraduate's tuition and fees for the fall and spring semesters. Recipients must be at least half-time students (6 credits) and have proof of employment at the **beginning of the semester** to qualify for the scholarship. Other than employment, if there is another reason(s) why a student recipient cannot attend full-time, the student must provide a written statement as to what preventative obligations that he/she has.

Without proof of employment, students **must** be enrolled full-time (12 credits) and provide proof of active class enrollment prior to the scholarship award being released. The release of this award will be **after** the last day to withdraw from each semester. All scholarship recipients are expected to actively participate and attend courses he/she is enrolled. Applicants looking for a rewarding visual arts experience are encouraged to apply!

Note:

- Scholarship monies will only be released **after** the last day to withdraw from each semester.
- Scholarships for the spring semester are contingent on successful course completion during the fall semester.
- If the recipient fails to successfully complete semester courses, or fails to meet scholarship criteria, scholarships will be rescinded and allotted toward another Visual Arts scholarship candidate.

THOSE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY (Visual Arts Scholarship)

Only continuing CSI Visual Arts majors will be considered for the Visual Arts Scholarship. The awarding of a Visual Arts Scholarship does **not** mean a student is admitted to the college. All admission standards must be met before a scholarship can be awarded.

To be considered for an award, applicants must deliver a digitized portfolio via thumb-drive or provide a link for his/her personal website to the CSI Department of Visual Arts by the **second Friday** in April.

Scholarship recipients must be enrolled as a **Visual Arts major** to qualify for the Visual Arts Scholarship. All scholarship recipients must also receive qualified advising toward the Visual Arts course curriculum to ensure recipients are enrolled in scholarship-eligible courses: the scholarship only applies to appropriate Visual Arts and General Education courses outlined by the Visual Arts AA degree.



PORTFOLIO

The digital applicant portfolio is essential for a scholarship award and attention should be given to its composition: selection of the strongest artwork, high-quality/high-resolution images, good lighting, sharp focus, clean backgrounds & foregrounds, etc., is important in award consideration. Portfolios must include the following:

- 1) The portfolio must contain *at least 10, but no more than 15 digital jpeg or pdf image files* of all 2D and/or 3D artwork. The digital portfolio must be located within a thumb-drive or personal website.
- 2) The portfolio must include the <u>physical</u>, <u>written portion of the application</u>. Within the written application, the thumb-drive or website images must be identified via these criteria: image number and/or title of work, medium and year of completion.
- 3) The portfolio must include a short, typed letter requesting consideration for the Visual Arts Scholarship award, including a statement about your education and career goals, potential as an art student and financial need(s).

All applicants must submit the portfolio materials in a resealable envelope that lists applicant name, address, phone number and scholarship sought on the envelope exterior. This envelope must also include the physical application and thumb-drive (if submitting portfolio through this method) for the scholarship sought. If you wish to have your portfolio returned to you after this date, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE) within the submitted resealable envelope.

Note:

- If the portfolio is within a personal website, applicants must provide a legible and locatable web address—and link—within the physical application form.
- If submitting a thumb-drive, candidates must digitally and physically label the thumb-drive device with his or her full name. These measures will help prevent thumb-drive devices from accidentally being lost during application collection and reviewing process.
